

110 Tower fights rumors that government is moving in

The owners of 110 Tower, the highrise across the street from the county courthouse downtown, have been battling rumors "that the building is going to be a government entity, because of its proximity to the court houses," according to a public relations consultant for the building, Deidre Krause.

People have been talking about it as a possible site for court offices or courtrooms, as Broward County struggles to pay for and build more courtrooms.

The rumor-clamor only got louder after AutoNation left the Tower and headed to the Stiles 200 Las Olas Circle building. They left a giant empty space in the tower that used to be named for AutoNation.

But leasing company Transwestern announced this week a big new lease, which seemingly would quiet all the chatter about government invading the tower. The entire 20th floor will be taken up by Luks and Santaniello, an insurance and corporate defense law firm that wants to be close to the Broward County Courthouse.
